Welcome to Old St. Mary's Church! And welcome back to Mass in person!

Since the First Sunday in Advent in 2022, the general dispensation from attendance at Mass has been lifted by Cardinal Cupich.

If you are prevented from attending Sunday Mass due to illness, or another "grave cause," or are a caregiver, you are not obligated to attend Mass but are invited to "keep holy the Sabbath" in a way that helps you.

As always, especially in cold and flu season, do take care of yourself and observe precautions to keep you and others healthy. You still have the option to wear a mask, sanitize and make other choices in church that keep you safe. Old St. Mary's will continue to live stream all our Masses for those unable to come in person.

Never permit me to be separated from You.





Oil of the Sick

This Oil of the Sick has been blessed by our Bishop for the healing of body, mind and soul. May the sick who are anointed with it experience the compassion of Christ and his saving love.

Oil of Catechumens

This Oil of Catechumens has been blessed by our Bishop for the anointing of those preparing for Baptism.

Through this anointing they are strengthened by Christ to resist the power of Satan and reject evil in all its forms, as they prepare for the saving waters of Baptism.

Sung response: Blessed be God forever.

Holy Chrism


This holy Chrism, a mixture of olive oil and perfume, has been consecrated by our Bishop and the Priests of our Diocese. It will be used to anoint infants after Baptism, those who are to be confirmed, Bishops and Priests at their Ordination, and altars and churches at the time of their dedication.

Sung response: Blessed be God forever.












Prayer After Communion

Following the Prayer after Communion, all kneel as the Blessed Sacrament is incensed. As the celebrant begins to carry the Blessed Sacrament in procession, all rise and are encouraged to join in procession to the place of repose. The Blessed Sacrament will be available for adoration in the commons until 11pm.

^{*}Verses 1-4 are repeated as necessary until the procession reaches the place of repose.
