

#### PASTOR'S WHITE BOARD

#### "The Money Talk"

Sometimes, in some places, the Pastor's Money Talk is infamous. People dread it. "He's asking for money – again?" "I give as much as I can." "Why don't others give more?" I'm sure you can fill in other responses, and the spectrum of those responses run from basic to elaborate and may at times include colorful language.

There is also the opinion that the Church should be run more like the best of businesses. And while it is true that we rely on people with business and financial acumen to serve on our Finance Council and to advise us in the parish, and that the Archdiocese also uses best business practices and advises parishes in those same methods (with oversight), there is a difference between businesses and churches.

Many businesses exist to raise money (especially non-profits) where it is used for the cause of the organization. Other businesses exist to make money (the for-profit range of institutions). But Church is not business. Church is community. What is most valuable to any Church are the people.

Churches, for years, have relied on the generosity of people who show up for regular services volunteering for the different tasks that need people to do them. Also, generosity of people sharing skills and time for activities and ministries. Not every parish has a paid music minister, or business manager, faith formation director or receptionist/secretary. And yet, people have volunteered and stepped forward because they want the parish missions of worship, outreach, education, and conversion to succeed.

We at Old St. Mary's, like many parishes throughout Chicagoland, are lucky, thanks to your generosity, to afford paid staff at some critical positions. Although our ability to keep all those positions since covid has declined. But as a parish looking to the future and asking the question of how to grow our ministry and profile as a parish of service to the community, we can use more people to staff other positions as volunteers or paid professionals. Articulating those needs, planning for them, and determining whether a volunteer can occupy the position or we need to pay someone is a very important discussion for us in these complicated times.

Our Church is also not a business in terms of setting fees (outside of education programs or other particular programs), telling people what they should give, asking to see financial statements and so forth. We rely on donations. We try to be transparent about what we spend money on (our monthly financial updates, end of year statements, and your personal access to your giving), we let you know where we are in resources and what we would like to accomplish.

Other Churches (not so much Catholic Churches) do actually set fees and membership dues for their congregations, and even publish giving records. Years ago the Catholic Church used to have "pew fees" and yearly giving was published annually, showing each families' contributions, but not so much in recent times.

The biggest difference, in how we look at finances from a Christian perspective, is simply to ask a couple of questions. "Do you see the resources and assets you have as a gift from God? And do you see that the giftedness God gives is meant to be used for the good of all?

The heart of the Gospel message – do you see you are blessed by God? Do you see that your generosity is itself a blessing and a reward by God to you? It is related to all the other special blessings each person has – talents, abilities, time, family, health and all the different resources that occupy human life.

A successful money talk by the pastor is one where you see your giftedness as blessings from God, and you frame and use those for the betterment of others and the progress of the Church. I hope your heart is open to all that God is giving you and calling you to do!

Through Sept, our parish took in \$40,096.78 less than we needed to break even.




#### Help Extend the Kids Tax Credit Scholarship Program
