PASTOR'S WHITE BOARD

COME YE THANKFUL PEOPLE! COME!

You may recognize the title of today's article from a hymn that came out in the 19th century. If you do, you'll remember the rest of the piece is set in imagery of harvest and what God provides. It is the "God provides" piece of the song that is the heart of my reflection today.

We are days before the celebration of our national holiday of Thanksgiving. I think it is still a celebration that touches many hearts. But you may have noticed how the décor for it gets scrunched between Halloween and Christmas? Or, you may have noticed that major football game coverage, advertising for black Friday, and the q-lines for Thanksgiving Day itself add major blocking filters to observance of the day.

For Christians, especially Christians who celebrate Eucharist/Communion, Thanksgiving should have much more prominence. That fancy Greek word, *Eucharist*, actually means thanksgiving. The meal that Jesus did at the last supper and the meal he does for us at every Mass, is his giving thanks to God (his Father) for the grace to be one of us. It is also his giving thanks to us for bringing our lives (just as they are) to him and allowing us to be transformed.

It is that transformation, in the Eucharist, where we are given the ability to offer thanks ourselves. To see ourselves, each other, the world around us with God's loving eyes – because he is creator, directly or through the pathways of science – is to see spectacle and miracle. At a time when our world is topsy-turvy, we need to be more deliberate in noticing what is beneath the surface, the blessings that are there and everything that gives us life and hope.

A good exercise for this week: take an objective step backward, look around, appreciate all the diversity and wonder we all share. That should call us to better care for one another and put aside what can divide us, and what makes us distrust each other. Pilgrims and Native Americans came together to survive, back in the day. How did they learn to trust? And beyond trust, how did they come to appreciate the other and then work together to discover the deliciousness of a banquet of being together.

The other step, after coming together for the meal – there is another guy in our faith history that brought people to a meal – is what it means afterward, when we have time to reflect on what happened. Jesus brought them into a meal where they were clueless about what would happen the next day. But they were so glad, so thankful to be with him then. And they would be even more thankful they had that Thursday when they would get to Easter Sunday and beyond.

So, come, you thankful people, come! Celebrate with gusto this Thanksgiving. Realize how blessed you are, and the blessings that are magnified when we share in acts of thanksgiving.

Through Oct, our parish took in \$50,917.25 less than we needed to break even.


A Tax-Savvy Way to Support Old St. Mary's Parish
