

PASTOR'S WHITE BOARD

Paulist Fathers in Chicago

As we begin Advent and a new liturgical year, it is often helpful to pause, reflect on where we are at and how we arrived here. The Paulist Fathers came to Chicago in 1903 at the request of Archbishop Quigley. This was only the 3rd foundation for the young American community, established in 1858. First is St. Paul the Apostle, the Paulist Mother Church in NYC. Second is Old St. Mary's-San Francisco [1894].

Archbishop Quigley invited the Paulists to Chicago in 1903, serving at Old St. Mary's, located at 9th and Wabash following the fire of 1871. The parish at the time was known as "the oddest assemblage of parishioners in the city," according to one Chicago Tribune article. The Paulists, missionaries in the ever-expanding United States, served a Chicago community comprised of "tourists, transients, people who worked at night" [from Centennial Yearbook], and an array of others with their own diversity. Eventually the church would be located at VanBuren and Wabash, and 1500 S. Michigan Ave. with ministries adapting to the community at each location.

As we've repeatedly said with Renew My Church, as mission and ministry have changed, the Paulist Fathers have served in different capacities. With the addition of Old St. Mary's Catholic School in 2004, the ministry continues to evolve, but the mission remains steadfast in its resolve to preach the unchanging truths of the Gospel in ways that adapt to communications methods and abilities of people today. And I would underscore, the preaching of the Gospel is not something Paulist's do in isolation, but with the help of many others – especially including yours.

When Fr. Rene Constanza, CSP and Fr. Dat Tran, CSP were here earlier in November, their purpose was to listen to how the Paulist Mission has taken root, how the parish is doing, and how the Paulists are doing. They were also here to share general Paulist news, and directions from our recent Paulist Assembly.

There is a rumor out there, after their visitation, that we're withdrawing from Chicago. That is a misrepresentation of what they said. They pointed out that the number of priests we have available for assignment is down, and that the community will be withdrawing from a couple of foundations in the next couple of years. But that discussion within the community, and the decisions following the discussion are still to come.

With our storied history in Chicago, and the Archdiocese of Chicago's own impact on the American Church, the combined ministries seem to be a good fit. Your involvement in Old St. Mary's Parish, and your understanding of mission through Renew My Church and Paulist outreach is crucial. Our leadership visitors want you to know this is a special place, and they are very encouraging of your efforts to make this "oldest parish in Chicago" the most dynamic parish as well.

The heart of Paulist Mission is to inspire all people in Christ. I hope you will continue to explore your call and how you can participate in making that happen, even as you join with us to make our ministry stronger.



The Giving Tree is up in the Commons! Each ornament on the tree has a gift that may be purchased for an adult or child at one of the parishes, or agencies, being helped by Old St. Mary's. We are highlighting these charitable partners so you can learn a little more about how your generous gift will make a difference.

This week we are highlighting Kolbe House.and Our Lady of Sorrows

Kolbe House provides in-jail, family, and re-entry ministries as well as restorative justice. Priest, religious and lay volunteers from across the Archdiocese visit Cook and Lake County jails to provide

prayer and communion services and one-on-one pastoral ministry. Kolbe House also provides pastoral accompaniment for families with a loved one in jail, emergency assistance when necessary, and resources like public aid, counseling, and community support. Just two blocks from Cook County jail, their location allows them to meet immediate needs of individuals when they are released, including food, CTA passes, clothing, and connections with housing and other support.

Our Lady of Sorrows (OLS) is a Catholic parish in the East Garfield neighborhood on the west side of Chicago. It's outreach program has been feeding and clothing the homeless and poor of the community since the great depression! During the holiday season they provide food and toys to over 400 families. The church has numerous family and friends from OSM that have been helping out for years by volunteering, donating coats, hats and gloves, and monetary funding.
