

PASTOR'S WHITE BOARD

Third Sunday of Advent

"Rejoice in the Lord, always. I shall say it again, Rejoice!" [Phil 4:4]

The pink candle, the pink vestments, the beginning of Advent's second season. The stunning imagery as we reach the third Sunday of Advent is complimented by an equally flamboyant John the Baptist whom people found both inspirational and curious. We have a simple question, "do these images and words of scripture move us?"

Last Sunday, Bishop Lombardo joined us and celebrated Confirmation for our candidates. Congratulations to them and their families for reaching this milestone of participation in the faith, and proclaiming your desire to continue to live it out.

All of us, along with them, are on the trajectory of our last week before Christmas. Christmas, and its focus on Jesus (God) who becomes human in the flesh – the fancy name is incarnation – is overlooked in our times with too much focus on the baby in the manger, and all the trappings of the holiday. This week with the "Rejoice" part is meant to go to the deep roots of God's coming in our world that have inspired the trappings and the music we all take to heart in the season. Strangely, many of our Christmas trappings are layers we must peel away to get to the central mystery of Christmas, much like getting to the most inner figure of a Russian doll.

But the meaning of Jesus, becoming flesh, is what gets us to celebrate Confirmation and say we are strong enough to tell the story of God among us, God sharing his life with us, and God by the gift of his flesh and blood makes us Christ in the world. It is a mystery. It is a tough mystery.

A great compliment for our newly Confirmed, would be to ask them to tell the Christmas story. Not from a book, but from their hearts – with their own ruffles, and flourishes, because they are considered adult storytellers of the faith now. And for those of us who do not live with a newly confirmed, we must be the storytellers of how God's being human in Jesus makes a difference today.

So Rejoice! The Lord is practically here. We are testaments to the mystery as Christian disciples.

TAX STATEMENTS

You can provide your current address information by calling the parish office, dropping a note in the collection basket or sending a note by mail.

DONATE YOUR IRA REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION

You cannot keep money in your employer-sponsored retirement plan(s) indefinitely. Once you reach retirement, you will need to withdraw money from these funds annually. This is a great opportunity to begin or grow your philanthropic giving.

If you are the account owner of one of these types of accounts and you have reached age 72 (73 if you reach age 72 after Dec. 31, 2022), you have a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).

The RMD is the smallest amount account holders must withdraw from employer-sponsored retirement plans each year once they reach retirement. If you fail to meet your RMD, the amount not withdrawn will be taxed at 50%.

If you have an RMD on your own account or an inherited account and you do not need the funds, donating to charity (Old St. Mary's) is a great option. Your required withdrawal will be included in your taxable income and cannot be rolled into other tax-deferred accounts. However, donating your RMD is a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).

Up to \$100,000 of your distribution from an employer-sponsored retirement account (including but not limited to your RMD) is a QCD.

Make your donation by December

31 to qualify this year.


