

#### Our Parish Mission

Founded in 1833, Old St. Mary's Parish is the first Catholic parish in the Chicago area. Guided for more than a century by the vision of the Paulist Fathers, we are a diverse and welcoming community dedicated to serving the spiritual needs of the Loop, South Loop and the greater Chicago area. As a unified Church and School community, Old St. Mary's Parish promotes the mission of the Paulist Fathers to welcome those who have been away from the church, to build bridges of respect and collaboration with people of diverse backgrounds and religions, and to promote justice and healing in our society.

#### **New Years News**

As we start the New Year, you, me and many others often take the opportunity to change things up, make some new resolutions for action, and evaluate where we have been and where we are going. The great thing about being Catholic – we also get to do this during Lent. But let's not miss the January opportunity.

I'm wondering if you are seeing the pastor look more tired than usual these days? I certainly feel more tired than usual and wish to share with you some of the things I'm dealing with and invite you to join me in moving our parish forward.

Maryellen Harrington, our Director of Lifelong Faith Formation is taking on a new position working with the Augustinians in Chicago, and is stepping away from directorship. She is helping us out during the transition to a new person, but that also tells you I am busy searching for and interviewing candidates for us. Please pray for her, and pray for the Spirit's guidance as Old St. Mary's looks for its next Director of Lifelong Faith Formation.

Fr. Stu is now in California at the UCLA Newman Center. You can write to him at 10750 Ohio Ave, Los Angeles, CA 90024. With his departure, we are blessed to have various Paulists filling in for Sacramental duties – thanks to Frs. Ciccone, McGarry and Cary who served us in 2023. Upcoming, Fr. Bill Edens, CSP and Fr. Tom Holahan, CSP will help us out in January and February. All of these Paulists, and including Fr. PJ, are in senior ministry and serve the parish part time. Until a new appointee is a full-timer, I'm it for full time priest ministry.

But the blessings of being part of a parish is the understanding that the priests do not do it all – no matter how good they are or how much energy they have. Many of the parishes that closed in the Archdiocese had very capable priests, but the participation of the people was lacking. We as parish have very capable and talented people (YOU) but we need your involvement to help our parish to thrive and be creative in living the faith.

I am inviting you to our Parish Town Hall meeting on **January 22 at 6:00p.m. in the church**. You would probably expect we'll report on finances, and we'll talk about participation, but we need your voices to give us a clearer sense of abilities and interests and how we can create our parish anew in this post-covid era. In 1833 people in Chicago formed this parish. They gathered, talked and instigated a plan for moving forward. Here we are 190 years later, 22 years into our newest ministry site with the simple question? How are we as people of faith, joined together with each other, going to make a difference?

More news coming – it always is. I hope to see you on January 22 as we reimagine Old St. Mary's Church with your guidance.



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK – Examples of Our Faith — St. Tarcisius

St. Tarcisius (263-275) was a 12-year-old boy who lived in 3rd-century Rome. Although what is known of him is legend taken from a poem written by Pope Damasus (366-384), he is still considered an important Catholic martyr, remembered for protecting the Eucharist from desecration with his life.

According to legend, Tarcisius served as an acolyte. One of his duties was to aid in visiting the Christians imprisoned for their beliefs in Rome, bringing them the Eucharist.

One day, as Tarcisius was on his way to the prison, carrying the consecrated Host from a secret underground Mass to those in need, he was confronted by a group of boys who demanded to know what he was carrying. Realizing the sacredness of his mission, Tarcisius refused to reveal the contents of his pouch, even in the face of the boy's threats of violence. Subsequently, the boys beat him and stoned him to death, martyring him as he protected the Body of Christ.

St. Tarcisius' sacrifice serves as a powerful reminder of the immense value of the Eucharist and how important it is to serve those who desire to receive Christ. His story also speaks to the incredible value of the church's youth and God's special mission in each of their lives. He is the patron saint of altar servers and first communicants.

In 2010, at the end of a general audience dedicated to altar servers, Pope Benedict XVI blessed a 16-foot statue of Saint Tarcisius in St. Peter Square. The event was attended by some 50,000 altar servers from around the world. St. Tarcisius, pray for us!


