

It Is Your Parish - What Do You Want to Do to Make us Thrive?

Monday night we have our latest parish town hall meeting. It is a night for talking about the future. A night for you to help us move into the future, using faith and companionship as tools.

We held two town hall meetings in 2023. January 26 about 15 people came to a "State of the Parish" report with an Open Forum. We talked about why people were and were not coming, a bit about how the parish was formed, and asking what we can do to move forward. People also thought three of the questions in the overview handout that night were important, maybe put over the door to the worship space for Lent: "Do you realize your importance? What do you need? How can we help together?

People gathered that night said they were finding hope by talking together and getting each other's insights. Other thoughts: creating easier access to be involved in the parish; creating pathways to bring people together around core values (something for Lent?); by getting to know each other, seeing one community with families in school and families out of school or in other schools.

The May 25 town hall saw about 30 folks present. Pastor Brad and Principal April addressed a series of pre-submitted questions, ranging from dates and style of First Eucharist and sacraments, to security and safe environment questions in the school, and particular administrative and curriculum issues. Some discussion and input was gleaned, but there were not many general questions from the floor, or people stepping forward to lead new opportunities.

This Monday (January 22), the 6p.m. meeting will have more openness to questions from the floor and opportunities for significant involvement. Generally, the leadership of the parish will give brief overviews of their areas, field some questions and facilitate discussion between you. We are certainly looking for new leaders and people with particular skill sets to help us move forward as a parish. The question every parish seeks an answer to is how are you going to move us forward? That is the question priests ask you (the laity). What do you want us as parish to put in place, and what commitment will you make to have that happen? You are that important!

True, a pastor is called to put forward a vision, but this is not done in a vacuum. It is done in prayer and collaboration. I receive a strange question from time to time, "why are you trying to force us to go to Mass on Sunday?" The simple answer is, we can't do Mass without you. And Mass on Sunday is the focal point for the community. Each Sunday is a little Easter, and the recognition that Christ calls us together. Our wide diversity and ability to see what we can become as a community is at the heart of our faith. The more we take that to heart, the more transformed we are as a parish and community.

This weekend you will hear about the Paulists on Saturday and Sunday. The understanding that the Paulists are bigger than the parish (that is, you are networked to this extraordinary group of priests across the country of many ages and styles who are striving to make America more holy) is helpful spiritually and practically. But that reality also offers us as a parish an added layer of faith development that no other parish in the Archdiocese has. We can talk about that on Monday too.

SAINT OF THE WEEK – EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH

St. Juliana of Cornillon (1193-1258), also known as St. Juliana of Liège, was born near modern-day Liège, Belgium. When she was 5 years old, she and her twin sister became orphans. Following the deaths of their parents, the sisters were entrusted to the care of the Augustinian nuns at Mont-Cornillon. Growing up among the religious, Juliana's spiritual journey flourished. At age 13, she entered the order.

Juliana's profound love for Christ in the Eucharist was ignited during her time at the convent. She regularly participated in Mass and spent hours in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. In her prayers, she often experienced mystical visions, reinforcing her belief in the real presence of Jesus in the consecrated bread and wine.

Driven by her desire to see a dedicated feast to honor Christ in the Eucharist, St. Juliana took it upon herself to promote the idea fervently. She eventually became the Prioress of the canonry and frequently confided in her mentor, Canon John of Lausanne, telling him about her visions and her hope for the feast. He shared her experiences with his contemporaries, including Pope Urban IV.

Though Juliana died in 1258, her cause won over Pope Urban IV. In 1264 he issued the papal bill "Transiturus de hoc mundo" which instituted the Feast of Corpus Christi on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. The feast aimed to celebrate and affirm the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, emphasizing the significance of the Blessed Sacrament in the life of the Church.

Juliana was canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1869 and is remembered not only for the pivotal role she played in establishing the Feast of Corpus Christi, but for her musical talents, teachings, and writings. St. Juliana of Cornillon, pray for us!




