

Loving Lent and the Discipline of Lent

You already know that Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are bedfellows this year. They don't often pair up (1923, 1924, 1945 the last century, this year and 2029 will complete the current century). The whole liturgical cycle is based on time and dates distilled from Easter, the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal (spring) equinox.

We love special dates. We love special occasions. They give us incentive at the times we need it. Special occasions inspire us to be creative or help us make connections we don't often make. What would chocolate makers, florists and jewelers do without Valentine's Day? We use those outside signs to help focus on something more basic – in the secular world Valentine's Day is the holiday of love. Not that love really needs a holiday, it is powerful in its own right and true lovers can make their own holidays.

It is not a stretch to say Ash Wednesday is a love holiday either. We have moved from the secular to the sacred world (and back again?), where the love of God is all about creating us and giving us partnership with one another, echoing God's own love. Further, the very dust we are made of and are returned to is deeply loved by God who calls us to see the whole cycle. "Remember you are dust, and to dust you will return." But with the ashes we are signed with the cross, the ultimate connection with God's love in Jesus – who became one of us so we can see him always with us.

If you are going to ask me about dispensations for Ash Wednesday, just let me say this. It is true the Church gives basic rules for fast and abstinence – which you see in a later bulletin – but because the choice of what we take on and give up is more about connecting to Christ's love and relying on it, the Lenten choices are disciplines. And like your own exercise discipline or dietary regimen it is under your control to know your need and limits – even as you connect to God.

A chocolate heart, or any kind of sweet is not particularly prohibited during Lent, but if you choose to refrain or indulge, the simple question, "how does this help you live life more fully and show the love of Christ better" is the best question. Think about it. Think about how these two celebrations work for us.

Lastly – if you have not figured out your "take on," or "give up," for Lent yet here are 3 thoughts.

- 1. Give an extra hour a week to God. Maybe: go to Mass, do a daily bible reading, set aside quiet time.
- 2. Check in on someone who needs help, needs a visit, or you just have not contacted in a while.
- 3. Don't do the same thing, do something new. Find your own blessing, give it a try!

They check the Abdominal Aorta which is the main Artery off the Heart for Aneurysms, the Thyroid which controls the Metabolism for cyst, nodules and enlargements, the Liver, Gallbladder and both Kidney's for cyst, masses, fluid build-up and tumors.

These screenings are NOT typically performed at annual physicals, nor will insurance companies pay for them unless you are symptomatic. Collectively, these screenings cost thousands in a hospital. Stroke Scan will be offering them to you for \$169 for all 7 combined. Health/Flex Savings Accounts are accepted.

Please call 866-935-7226 to schedule an appointment today. A representative will be visiting this weekend, February 3-4, to answer questions and for pre-registration.


