
OLD ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC CHURCH

Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving in a Year of Eucharistic Revival

As we continue our year of Eucharistic Revival and feel the love on Valentine's Day and the love of Ash Wednesday we have to realize that everything involved with loving comes through Jesus by the grace of the Holy Spirit and the power of the Father.

This reflection is an invitation to think about Lent, how we can find Jesus and make his love known.

Eucharist, Holy Communion is the reality of Jesus present with us in our day to day lives. If we look to Jesus as the source and summit of how we live our lives, we can readily see all kinds of possibilities for Lent. Let me suggest a few.

Almsgiving. It means giving to someone in need through an act of love. At Mass we should feel Jesus' love for us given unconditionally and lavishly – not because we deserve it, but because we need it. As we choose who we are helping this Lent, with acts or gifts of charity, we should examine what we have been given and decide how generous we are called to be to someone, or some group that is in need.

Fasting. One act of fasting overlooked these days is the fast before Holy Communion. Its purpose is to give us time to think about what we are fasting for - similar to any type of fast that helps our discipline and focus. Officially, the Church teaches "One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion. [CCL 919]. This also opens our hearts to those who hunger in the world, as well as those who cannot receive Eucharist, and pray and care for them.

Prayer. We all know the celebration of Mass is prayer. We all know there are prayers we can pray: familiar prayers, prayers we make up, prayers led by others. In the course of the Mass, there are several times a priest will say, "let us pray." Maybe as we get ready for Mass during Lent, we can think about people and needs to pray for (people we were going to give alms to, or the hungry we were going help – from above), and be ready when we hear "let us pray" to raise those prayers in our hearts and be open to other prayers we are being invited to consider.

Besides prayer, fasting and almsgiving, please remember all those (of many ages) who are seeking to enter the Church during the Easter season: preparing for Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist (Holy Communion), praying that they can experience Christ more fully leads us to experience Christ more fully ourselves. In its origins, Lent was all about those becoming fully engaged Christian, and still is.

Have a blessed season of Lent!

LENTEN REGULATIONS

(from February 14, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

FASTING is to be observed on Ash

Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and individuals who are ill should not jeopardize their health further by fasting.

BLACK HISTORY FACT

Did you know?

1565: St. Augustine, Florida

Blacks, both slave and free, help to found this oldest town in the United States. In 1693 Spain offers freedom in Florida to slaves who convert to Catholicism. Until 1763, these freed slaves lived in a community northeast of St. Augustine. Gracia Real de Santa Teresa de Mose, or Fort Mose (pronounced "Moh-say"), established in 1738, thus becomes the first free black town in the United States.


