You still have the option to wear a mask, sanitize and make other choices in church that keep you safe. Old St. Mary's will continue to live stream all our Masses for those unable to come in person.

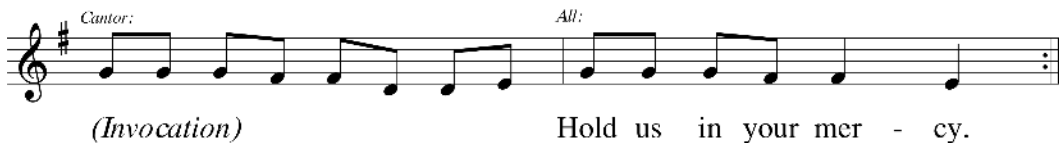
