
OLD St. Mary's Catholic Church



Our Parish Mission

Founded in 1833, Old St. Mary's Parish is the first Catholic parish in the Chicago area. Guided for more than a century by the vision of the Paulist Fathers, we are a diverse and welcoming community dedicated to serving the spiritual needs of the Loop, South Loop and the greater Chicago area. As a unified Church and School community, Old St. Mary's Parish promotes the mission of the Paulist Fathers to welcome those who have been away from the church, to build bridges of respect and collaboration with people of diverse backgrounds and religions, and to promote justice and healing in our society.

PASTOR'S WHITE BOARD

Entering Retreat

I hope that your Lent is progressing well. There is certainly more than enough happening, and many different ways to approach God through Jesus guided by the Holy Spirit!

I am doing something very unusual for me during this Lent, I'm going on retreat. Lent is usually such a busy time for me I just can't imagine getting away. But this whole year has been one non-stop event after another and I need time with my Lord. Please pray for me. I'll be praying for you, and seeking God's guidance with so many directions in my life, the life of the Paulists, my family, the life of the parish (that includes the school). I'm taking you all with me as I head to Scottsdale, AZ, and present you to God for blessings on you all.

The place I am going is often called Le Casa – also the Franciscan Renewal Center – and I have been there on retreat before. Have you ever done a personal, spiritual retreat? I try to go on retreat at least once a year, for at least 8 days. The longest silent retreat I've done was 33 days and was the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius.

I mention my personal retreats to both underscore that any person can take a retreat for any length of time and to say that there are also many types - depending on personal need and choice. I usually choose a silent directed retreat, but there are plain silent retreats, conference retreats, specialized retreats, retreats for men and women, activity retreats and many more. These are with spiritual focus, but you probably know there are business types of retreats too. Every retreat is an opportunity to be renewed and gain perspective on our lives.

We are also called to remember that Lent itself is the retreat for the whole Church. The season began as the retreat for those people seeking entrance to the faith through the Easter Sacraments. The forty days leading up to the Easter Vigil was for those in final preparation for the sacraments, and was also a time when the whole community would help them prepare.

While I am away, the RCIA folk continue their journeys to the Easter Vigil. You'll see in the bulletin their names and some reflections about their journeys. Please do remember them in prayer. And especially with the second scrutiny at 11, this Sunday the 10th, join them in reflecting on the blindness that can prevent us from seeing each other, and seeing what is really important in our lives. It is what Jesus desires of each of us – that we see.
