#### PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Did you know that Easter is all about surprise? Maybe not for us. In our culture it is a given the Jesus rises from the dead. Que the eggs, the bunnies, baskets, fancy clothes and everything else! Back to Jesus – here's the biggest surprise, that we must hold on to – NOBODY saw Jesus rise from the dead, NOBODY.

We are used to pictures of Jesus rising from the dead, but the bible says, "EMPTY TOMB!" None of the accounts of Jesus after his resurrection is a glorious impersonal levitation – they are all intimate personal encounters. He shows up for Mary Magdalene, to the disciples headed for Emmaus, the disciples in the locked room, seashore and mountaintop. Eventually he'll show up to Paul on his journey to Damascus.

But the empty tomb is meant to be a shocker. Death could not contain him. Death is still a stumbling block to non – believers. But to us believers (okay maybe grasping that Jesus rose from the tomb is still tough), our discovery that it was not a one-time occurrence – surprise! Shocker – Jesus rose from the dead, not a one-time occurrence but an ongoing reality! If you think it just happened once upon a couple of millennia ago – you miss the point, you miss the joy, you miss the profound message for each one of us.

That's why **ALLELUA** is this explosive word that jumps from our heart and soul. It conveys a reality that allows us to enter into that space where Jesus is alive and with us – and we know him in that encounter. I pray you will have a blessed Easter Sunday, Easter Season, and ongoing experience of Easter in all your lives!

Remember: Christ is Risen, Alleluia, Alleluia! Christ is Truly RISEN, Alleluia! ALLELUIA!!!

### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED **Spiritual Communion**

#### **Question:**

What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

#### Answer:

The practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.

Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way. ©LPi
