

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

First Holy Communion is a Very Big Deal - and Every other One Too!

At the Easter Vigil, when 10 folks of all ages came to the table of Communion and received Eucharist for the first time, our Holy Communion season at the parish began. And it won't surprise you that at the Vigil, before Communion, I said that, when someone comes to the table of the Lord and receives their First Eucharist (first of many we hope), "this is a very big deal."

It is not just a big deal because they are getting the Body and Blood of the Lord for the very first time (each communion is equally special), but they are being recognized for their participation and they are inspired by all of our participation. We become what we eat and drink that we might be Christ for one another. Truly a time of Blessing. This week, we will begin to see our youngsters receive at Mass:11am on April 14, we have 1 new communicant, at 11am May 5, we expect 16, other Masses will have different numbers.

Because of this, let me offer you a series of reflections in the next few weeks about Eucharist (especially in this year of Eucharistic Revival). Here are four thoughts. You may know these, but it never hurts to be reminded and given the opportunity for each of us to explain it further.

- 1. We believe that bread really becomes the body of Jesus the Risen Christ, not the fleshy remains of the human Jesus but the true body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ. I've heard some people try to dismiss this, saying it is only a symbol or it's only important to gather and remember Jesus, but as a Church, we believe it is more, Jesus changes the elements and us. And because we are changed, we are called to be more loving toward each other.
- 2. We believe that wine really becomes the blood of Jesus the Risen Christ, not the blood running through the veins of the human Jesus but the true blood, body, soul and divinity of Christ. The wine is complete in the same way I just mentioned that the bread is. And because we are changed, we are called to know that we can be healed, helped and forgiven by each other. (The bonus secret here: if you receive the cup you receive the body too and if you receive bread you receive the blood too we always receive the whole Christ.
- 3. When the bread and wine are changed into Christ's body and blood, it is a permanent change. All of it is eaten or drunk. All comes from the table and the actions and prayers we do and say together. From the table we are all fed as we gather at Mass. From the table we take Eucharist to the sick and dying to connect them with us and connect us all in Christ. What is left in the tabernacle will be adored and reflected on but will also be eaten as it is taken by ministers to those in need.
- 4. A tabernacle is either placed in its own chapel, or its own special place in the sanctuary of the Church. You find it by looking for the "sanctuary lamp" a candle that is always lit when the Blessed Sacrament is present. It is often red. You can usually find the Blessed Sacrament and genuflect toward it by spotting the candle. Then you are invited to kneel, sit or stand to pray and reflect on this reminder of what we have done at Mass.

Dear Old St. Mary's Community,

Happy Easter! May the joy and call to action of our Risen Lord be with you.

On behalf of Lauren Huelster (Lifelong Faith Formation Administrator) and me, I would like to say thank you for being so welcoming to and supportive of us as we have taken the helm of lifelong faith formation. We have been hard at work on reshaping the structure and ministerial strategy of lifelong faith formation for all ages in our parish and school as well as forming a truly united program between the parish and school. We are grateful to the teachers, catechists, and other groups we have asked to meet with and who have taken the time to meet with us.

In collaboration with April Greer as Principal of our school and with Fr. Brad's affirmation as Pastor, we want to take this opportunity to share the changes we are making to the sacramental preparation and administration structure starting next year (2024-2025 school year). We strongly believe that these changes will help build stronger support for formation and accompaniment of parents/caregivers as catechists in the domestic church and give our students the opportunity to be accompanied in faith formation that is more developmentally appropriate in exploring the deep mysteries of our Catholic faith.

2024-2025 Sacramental Year Changes

Sacrament	Current	Change
Reconciliation	Prepared for and received in 2nd Grade.	Prepared for in 2nd Grade and received at readiness of child in 3rd Grade.
Eucharist	Prepared for and received at child's readiness in 2nd Grade.	Prepared for in 3rd Grade and received at readiness of child in 4th Grade.
Confirmation	Prepared for in 7th and 8th Grade and received in 8th Grade.	Prepared for in 6th and 7th Grade, received in 7th Grade, and practiced in 8th Grade.

Children who are currently in 1st Grade (2023-2024) will be "grandfathered" in and receive First Reconciliation and Communion in the 2024-2025 year.

Youth who are currently in 6th and 7th Grade (2023-2024) will be "grandfathered" in and receive the sacrament of Confirmation in May of 2025. 6th Grade is considered being "grandfathered" due to the fact they will have only completed one full year of sacramental preparation rather than the standard two years required by the Archdiocese. As this is a transitional year, an exception will be made.

These exceptions are only made for *enrolled* students in Sunday Faith Formation and Old St. Mary's School in the 2023-2024 school year. New students will be required to enroll in the appropriate year based on the new structure.

We want to thank you in advance for your support of this new structure. More information will be forthcoming as we look forward to next year and beginning a renewed lifelong faith formation program at Old St. Mary's.

SAINT OF THE WEEK – EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH

St. Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, was the most prolific Christian missionary of all time. Due to a miraculous experience that he had on the road to Damascus, he went from persecuting early Christians to traveling all over the region preaching the Gospel of Jesus.

Paul's letters to the communities he served make up thirteen of the books of the New Testament today. His writings encourage new believers to learn about Jesus through Scripture and prayer, partaking in the Eucharist, and serving those in need. He was eventually beheaded as part of systematic executions of Christian leaders in Rome. St. Paul is known as the Apostle to the Gentiles, and the most prolific Christian missionary of all time.
