

PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Other Insights on Eucharist

What about you? Do you love the Eucharist? I ask the first communicants the most important question a pastor gets to ask – do you want to receive communion? And the kids eagerly answer yes. It does my heart good to hear their youthful enthusiasm and their willingness to talk about Jesus. What about you? Do you love receiving communion?

I think what distinguishes younger faith from more mature faith, is realizing that Eucharist is not a commodity - is not something you "get." It is something you receive, something Jesus gives, but there is no quid pro quo. Jesus WANTS to give you everything. It is not just getting Christ's Body and Blood "under the forms of bread and wine," it is more than that.

Saying, "Amen!" to the offering of the Body of Christ by the minister of communion, is saying three things. "Yes, I believe this is Jesus Christ giving himself to me." "Yes, I believe I am becoming what I receive." "Yes, I am receiving the whole Christ who loves me, who died for me and everyone else, and calls me to serve others."

I try to affirm for the kids, what I am trying to affirm for you here, that you have to understand foot-washing in order to be ready to receive communion. Jesus commanded his disciples (as Lord and Savior), "you must have your feet washed by me." "That's not the role of the head honcho, but that is what I am doing. Get it?" "I command you to wash each other's feet just as I have washed yours."

Notice – they don't get communion (as his disciples), don't get fed, nourished, or drawn into his life until they accept the washing feet part. Washing feet is Christian code for loving and taking care of each other – especially caring for those in need. ONLY THEN do they get communion. Only then do they (and we) GET that we are communion. In becoming what we eat, we must do all that he did. Jesus calls us to be him in our world. That bread and wine really become Jesus Body and Blood – truly and completely – is not nearly as miraculous as the realization we really become Jesus Body and Blood for each other. ***

Here's a more technical tidbit on the Eucharist for you – try it at your next party with other Catholics. There is a doctrine of the Church called "concomitance." We believe that Christ is never divided. The whole Christ – Body and Blood (soul and divinity) – is in the bread, or the wine. We receive the whole Christ in either, as well as in both. The fuller sign is to receive both, because Christ offered both at the last supper.

And likewise, in receiving, part of a host, half a host, a whole host of any size or several hosts (size and number do not matter) we also get the whole Christ, not more and not less. And to receive from the cup, a sip or more of from the cup, we again receive the whole Christ, not more not less.






Saturday, May 4, at the 5 pm Mass, we will joyfully welcome a child into our faith community through the sacrament of baptism.
